

# Rushcliffe School Learning Support (SEND)

## Our school offer

What we offer to all pupils with special educational needs or disabilities:

- The Dyslexia Friendly Quality Mark
- Literacy support in Key Stage 3
- Level 1 qualifications at KS4
- Vocational GCSEs
- Inclusion provision
- Quality first teaching including in class differentiation

What we offer over and above the core offer:

- Inclusion provision
- Working in partnership with outside agencies
- Specialist facilities/equipment to support SEND
- A range of resources e.g. laptops to support pupils, coloured overlays
- Input from other specialist services: e.g. advisory teachers via Local Authority, Educational Psychologist, health professionals, CAMHS, attendance officer, school nurse, school counsellors, social workers, breakfast and after school support
- Seasonal clubs which are supported by the learning support team

How the school promotes inclusion:

- Differentiated and inclusive learning environments in all classrooms
- Appropriate ability setting in some subjects, increasing through the year groups
- A wide range of extra- curricular activities during and after school
- Student leadership and Student Voice
- Personalised Learning Postcards
- Personalised Learning Pathways
- Early intervention through our specialist inclusion centre
- On-site specialist centre focusing on: academic achievement, self-esteem, emotional awareness, social expectations, positive behaviours for learning, and preparing for future economic well-being
- Half termly reviews and quality assurance frameworks

The school communicates with parents using the following methods:

- Communication with parents and outside agencies in identifying needs
- Attendance at meetings to discuss concerns and referrals
- Regular reviews for students on our SEND register
- Teacher Progress Reviews, with targets, sent home three times a year
- SEND staff available at Progress Evenings
- Parent workshops for dyslexia
- SEND Meet the Team events held regularly
- An 'Open-door' policy

- Accelerated Reader
- Learning links in year 7 (with targeted Literacy support)
- Literacy development work (years 8 & 9)
- Supported study
- Maths intervention
- Personalised mentoring and emotional therapy programmes
- Intervention support in the Orchard Centre
- Daily specialist English, maths and science lessons for targeted students at key stage 4
- Personalised learning programmes at key stage 4
- Early intervention programmes at key stages 3 and 4
- Specialist mentoring at key stages 3 and 4
- Partnerships with other local schools
